

Foundation Stage

The Foundation Stage area comprises four large classrooms, small group rooms and separate outdoor play areas. Children are admitted to the Foundation 1 (Nursery) class from the age of three. They start in the full time Foundation 2 (Reception) class in the academic year that they turn five.

Trips and visitors
