Early Years Foundation Stage

The Foundation Stage area comprises four large classrooms, small group rooms and spacious outdoor play areas. Children are admitted to the Foundation 1 (Nursery) class from the age of three. They start in the full time Foundation 2 (Reception) class in the academic year that they turn five. We offer a number of 30-hour Nursery places to children whose parents are eligible for this funding.

Trips and visitors

Recent trips have been to Winchester Planetarium, St Mary's Church in Shinfield, Bekonscot Model Village, Wisley gardens and Bucklebury Farm Park. We regularly take walks in the local SANG. Visitors to school include a farm, Zoolab, sports coaches, dance specialists, theatre groups, musicians, artists and writers. We also have close links with local community groups and establishments.



School Clubs

These include Capoeira, Multisports, Street Dance, football and a school choir. The school also has access to an excellent holiday club for both the Shinfield Infant and Junior schools.

Charging and Remissions Policy

We operate an Activity Fund for which termly or yearly voluntary contributions can be made for school activities and trips. We offer online payment and appointment booking facilities for parents.



Transition to Junior School

We have a close working partnership with Shinfield St Mary's CE Junior School. This includes a joint Governor/Local Advisor group, subject leader liaison, joint school policies and regular visits between children and staff. Effective transition provides excellent continuity of education in Shinfield village for your child throughout their primary school years.

High Standards

We strive to bring out the best in each child, and encourage him or her to make the most of his or her individual skills and talents. Your child's welfare and well-being are very important to us. In this school each person is a part of a caring and sharing community.
