Forest School



- Forest schools provide a specialised learning approach that offers children regular opportunities to achieve and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in a natural environment
- Experiences link to curriculum subjects: Science, Art, Geography and PSHE
- On Forest School days, please send your child to school in their school uniform





Group Challenge!

This is an activity that we include in a variety of lessons to encourage important skills such as collaboration, sharing and good speaking and listening. The children work towards a common goal in a pair or small group. They will be praised for their attitudes as much as for the end result. If your child wins a rosette it is because they showed excellent social skills and speaking and listening skills. The rosette is for them to keep!



Ways to help your child at home



- **Reading** - As per previous
- **KIRFS** – To be practised throughout the term in class and at home
- **Spellings** - Taught through Little Wandle each day. With a separate handwriting and spelling session x4 a week. Please practise common exception words in your child's planner, phonics information will be sent home each week on a Friday
- **Golden Folder** - Daily, children are encouraged to bring in writing and maths work from home to celebrate.

Please make sure all your child's belongings are named, including school uniform and shoes.



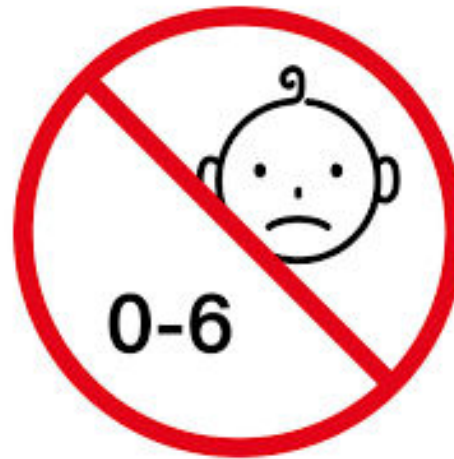
